The Corporate Transparency Act – It’s Coming! What Do You Need to Know?

The Corporate Transparency Act became law on January 1, 2021 as part of the National Defense Authorization Act. The Act will impact many of your clients and requires all U.S. corporations, limited liability companies and other entities to report beneficial owner information to the FinCEN, subject to limited exemptions. The Act includes notable penalties for noncompliance. The reporting requirements become effective once the Secretary of the Treasury adopts regulations to implement the Act’s reporting requirements and such regulations must be in place by January 1, 2022. This presentation will address key issues which counsel must be aware of under the Act, including: (1) Who is required to report under the Act?; (2) What information is required under the Act?; (3) When are reports required to be made to FinCEN under the Act?; (4) What penalties are there for failure to comply with reporting requirements?; and (5) What safeguards are in place to protect the information required to be reported under the Act?

Ending American Racial-Ethnic Discrimination: Alternative Structural Perspectives and Legal Implications. The Road to Damascus?

Prof. Olu Oyinlade, University of Nebraska-Omaha

What is your race? What makes you of the race you claim? Is your race a biological or a social fact? And, what is your ethnicity? If a woman from Kenya tells you her ethnicity is Kikuyu, not Kenyan, and a man from Nigeria tells you his ethnicity is Igbo, not Nigerian, how would you label your culture without calling it American? Have you ever been a victim of racial-ethnic discrimination? How? Why? Why not? Have you, too, discriminated based on race or ethnicity under certain or all circumstances? Why is discrimination a common part of American life, and why has it remained so since the founding of the nation? What has kept discrimination alive despite many legislative efforts intended to stop it?

In this seminar, Professor Oyinlade will lead the audience in an examination of the meaning and social construction of race and ethnicity in the United States. He will lead a discussion on the legal-structural basis for the existence and maintenance of racial and ethnic discrimination, as well as the various legal efforts to ending it. Lastly, he will discuss potential reasons why legal efforts have failed and then present alternative approaches that could effectively end discrimination with possible legal obstacles and paradoxes. Active participation involving critical analysis and controverting legal and cultural perspectives will be encouraged from the audience.
